HIGHLIGHTS/SITUATION UPDATE (23/07/2020)

- The country is in Stage 4 of the State of Emergency (29 June 2020 -17 September 2020)
- Walvis Bay, Swakopmund, and Arandis Local Authority Areas in Erongo region will remain in Stage 3 (from 07 July 2020 until 23h59 of 03 August 2020).

Nine (9) of the 14 regions have reported confirmed cases; with Erongo reporting the highest 1501 (92.8%) followed by Khomas 60 (3.7%).

- Today (23/07/2020), 3 recoveries have been recorded from Erongo region.
- To-date, 22 Health Care Workers have tested positive for COVID-19, with 4 new confirmations today (23/07/2020).
- Cumulatively, 1552 (95.9%) cases are local transmissions while 66 (4.1%) are imported.
- Up to 965 confirmed cases in Erongo region are still to be placed in isolation facilities.
- More male cases 925 (57.2%) were recorded compared to female cases 693 (42.8%)




Figure 1: Distribution of suspected and confirmed COVID-19 cases in Namibia by District, 23 July 2020

- The most affected ages are within 20 and 49 years 1255 (77.6%).
- Those aged 60 and above constitute 42 (2.6%) of those affected.

- To date, 20595 tests have been conducted by NIP & Path-Care laboratories (including 2243 retests).
- Since the beginning of the outbreak, 4141 contacts of confirmed cases have been identified, 349 new contacts were identified within the last 24 hours.
- Cumulatively, 1325 contacts have completed their 14 days of follow up, while 899 out of 2520 active contacts were monitored today.



Figure 2: Age and sex distribution of COVID-19 confirmed cases 23 July 2020




Figure 3: Epi-curve for confirmed COVID-19 cases 23 July 2020

Namibia has recorded 1618 COVID-19 cases since 13 March 2020. Up to 534 (33.0%) of the total cases were recorded during week 29 (Figure 3).

- A high number of cases were recorded in the past three weeks as a result of:
 - -Spread of local transmission in Walvis Bay district
 - -Enhanced Active Case Search and testing, averaging 300 tests daily in the past weeks.
- Call centre continues operation for 24 hours daily. Today, 1260 calls were answered including 19 alerts.

Table 3: Number of people in mandatory quarantine facilities, 23 July 2020

- Since March 2020, 4945
 people have been placed into
 supervised quarantine
 facilities around the country.
- A total of 729 people are currently in quarantine with 45 new admissions in the past 24 hours.
- Since March 2020, 109 people who were in quarantine have tested positive for COVID-19.

- A total of 348 trucks entered the country through various ground crossing points in the last 24 hours.
- Of these trucks, 50.6% were heading to Khomas,
 20.7% to //Kharas while
 16.1% were heading to Erongo region.

PUBLIC HEALTH ACTION

- A high-level delegation team has been sent to Erongo region on 22 July 2020, to engage stakeholders on the impact of COVID-19 in the region.
- National level continues to support the regions
- Regions have enhanced social mobilization on COVID-19
- Targeted testing in Walvis Bay is ongoing
- Regions have intensified surveillance on travellers from Erongo region for early case detection

CHALLENGES

- Inadequate Human resources in the regions
- Inadequate ICU facilities and ICU equipment in the regions
- Inadequate isolation units, at health facilities in the regions.
- O Inadequate PPE
- Inadequate nasopharyngeal swabs and appropriate transport media.

RECOMMENDATIONS

- The Ministry to fast track the appointment of critical personnel for the response in the region.
- Establish fully equipped ICU and isolation units at health facilities in the regions.
- O Logistics pillar to continue with the procurement and distribution of sufficient PPE to the regions to ensure that response is not interrupted.
- NIP to continue sourcing for swabs and appropriate transport media.
