- The entire country will remain in Stage 3 of the State of Emergency (29 August 2020 12 September 2020).
- A curfew (20h00-05h00) is applicable nationwide as from 29 August 2020 12 September 2020.
- Windhoek, Rehoboth and Okahandja Local Authority Areas are under travel restrictions (29 August 2020 – 12 September 2020)
- ➤ The Hosea Kutako International Airport is open as of today (01 September 2020).
- ➤ Cumulatively, 7755 (98.8%) cases are local transmissions while 89 (1.1 %) are imported.
- There is community transmission in Erongo and Khomas regions.
- The other 12 regions have recorded a rapid increase in confirmed cases was recorded in the last month.
- More male cases 4289 (54.7%) were recorded compared to female cases 3555 (45.3%).
- To-date, 333 (4.2%) Health Care Workers have tested positive for COVID-19.
 - 223 (67.0%) State
 - 109 (32.7%) Private
 - 1 (0.3%) NGO
- Today (01/09/2020), 75 recoveries have been recorded from 4 regions; 31//Kharas, 26 Oshana, 9 Hardap and 1 Oshikoto.
- > Two (2) fatalities were recorded today from 2 regions; 1 Khomas and 1 Oshana.

- All fourteen (14) regions have reported confirmed cases; with Erongo reporting the highest 3495 (44.6%) followed by Khomas 3443 (43.9%).
- Khomas region is currently the epicenter of the outbreak.
- Of the total confirmed cases, 3454 (44.0%) have recovered.
- Cumulatively, 69 (84.1%) of the fatalities were known to have multiple co-morbidities (Table 2).




Figure 1: Epi-curve for confirmed COVID-19 cases 01 September 2020

Namibia has recorded **7844** COVID-19 cases since 13 March 2020. Up to **2123** (**27.1%**) of the total cases were recorded during week 34 (Figure 1).

- A high number of cases were recorded in the past seven weeks as a result of:
 - -Spread of local transmission in the country
 - -Enhanced surveillance including active case search.
- Call center continues operation for 24 hours daily. Today, 909 calls were answered including 6 alerts.

- To date, 62089 tests have been conducted by NIP, Path-Care, NAMDEB, and UNAM laboratories (including 3795 re-tests).
- Since the beginning of the outbreak, 14927 contacts of confirmed cases have been identified, 450 new contacts were identified within the last 24 hours from 11 regions.
- Cumulatively, 6057 contacts have completed their monitoring period, while a total 848 (9.8%) of the contacts have tested positive
- Today, 5161 (59.6%) out of 8666 active contacts were monitored.




Figure 2: Distribution of suspected and confirmed COVID-19 cases in Namibia by District as of 01 September 2020

- The 20-49 years age- brackets constitute **5833** (**74.4%**) of the confirmed cases, while a sizable proportion of the 50-59 age group **870** (**11.1%**).
- Among those aged 30-39, a significant proportion of males 1224 (15.6%) are infected more than females 986 (12.6%).
- The under 5 make up 162 (2.1%) of the total cases.
- Aged 60 years and above constitute 324 (4.1%) of the confirmed cases.




Figure 3: Age and sex distribution of COVID-19 confirmed cases As of 01 September 2020

- A total of 177 trucks entered the country through various ground crossing points in the last 24 hours.
- Of these trucks, 83 (46.9%) were heading to Erongo, 56 (31.6%) to Khomas while 14 (7.9%) were heading to //Kharas region.
- The remaining 24 (13.6%) were heading to the other 8 regions.

PUBLIC HEALTH ACTION

- Recruitment of local volunteers into the response in the districts and regions is ongoing.
- Continuous support to the regions by the national level.
- Public awareness on COVID-19 prevention measures is ongoing

CHALLENGES

- Large data backlog awaiting entry into excel data base and DHIS2.
- Inadequate ICU facilities and ICU equipment at referral hospitals and high care units in the districts.
- Inadequate ambulances in the regions.
- Inadequate isolation units, at health facilities in the regions.

RECOMMENDATIONS

- Fast tracking of efforts to use GoData app and DHIS2.
- Provision of fully equipped ICU facilities at referral hospitals and high care units in the districts.
- Procurement of ambulances in the regions to ensure prompt response.
- Establish fully equipped isolation units at health facilities in the regions.
