Definition of Indicators	References
1. mCPR : % of women of reproductive age who are using (or whose partner is using) a modern contraceptive method at a particular point in time. 2. unmet need : % of fecund women of reproductive age who want no more children or to postpone having the next child, but are not using a contraceptive method, plus women who are currently using a traditional method of family planning. 3. demand satisfied : percentage of women (or their partners) who desire either to have no additional children or to postpone the next child and who are currently using a modern contraceptive method. 4. Unintended pregnancies : Nb of pregnancies that occurred at a time when women (and their partners) either did not want additional children or wanted to delay the next birth. 5. unsafe abortion : Nb of unsafe abortions that did not occur during a specified reference period as a result of the protection provided by modern contraceptive use during the reference period. 6. Facilities stocked out : % of facilities stocked out of each type of contraceptive offered, on the day of assessment. 7. Method availability : % of primary (resp. secondary/tertiary) service delivery points with at least 3 (resp. 5) modern methods of contraception available on day of assessment. 8. Total fertility rate : Average nb of children a hypothetical cohort of women would have at the end of their reproductive period if they were subject during their whole lives to the fertility rates of a given period and if they were not subject to mortality. 9. Adolescent birth rate (ABR) : Nb of births to adolescent females, aged 15-19 occurring during a given reference period per 1,000 adolescent females. 10. Maternal mortality ratio (MMR) : Annual nb of female deaths from any cause related to or aggravated by pregnancy or its management per 100 000 live births. 11. Infant mortality rate (IMR) : probability of dying between birth and age 1 per 1000 live births.
