

HIGHLIGHTS/SITUATION UPDATE (14/10/2020)

- A total of 12103 cases have been recorded in a population of approximately 2.5 Million people, making it about 0.5% of the population infected.
- More male cases 6579 (54.4%) were recorded compared to female cases 5524 (45.6%).
- Of the total confirmed cases, 480 (4.0%) Health Care Workers (HCWs) have tested positive for COVID-19 todate.
 - 309 (64.4%) State; 168 (35.0%) Private, 3 (0.6%) NGO
- Today (14/10/2020), 184 recoveries have been recorded from 5 regions region; the recovery rate now stands at 85.3%.
- All fourteen (14) regions have reported confirmed cases; Khomas and Erongo regions reported the highest with 5647 (46.7%) and 3892 (32.2%) respectively.
- Of the total fatalities, 101 (77.7%) are COVID-19 deaths while 29 (22.3%) are COVID-19 related deaths.
- The cases continue to erupt among closed settings such as schools, police holding cells and prisons.




Figure 2: Epi-curve for confirmed COVID-19 cases, as of 14 October 2020

- Up to 2123 (17.5%) of the total cases were recorded during week 34 (Figure 2).
- After a peak in epi-week 34, the country has seen a gradual reduction in the average number of confirmed cases from 303 to 44 in epi-week 41.
- The National Call center continues operation for 24 hours daily.

Today (14/10/2020), 1075 calls were answered including 100 alerts.




Figure 1: Distribution of suspected and confirmed COVID-19 cases by District, 14 October 2020

	contacts of confirmed cases have been					
	identified, 68 new contacts were identified					
	within the last 24 hours from 12 regions.					

- Cumulatively, 21247 contacts have completed their monitoring period, while a total of 2942 (38.8%) contacts of confirmed cases have tested positive.
- Today, 7566 (99.7%) out of 7585 active contacts were monitored.

- Since March 2020, 16989 people have been placed into mandatory quarantine facilities around the country.
- A total of 938 people are currently in quarantine, with 74 new admissions in the last 24 hours.

- The 20-49 years age-brackets constitute 8644 (71.4%) of the confirmed cases, while a sizable proportion of the 50-59 age group is 1240 (10.2%).
- A total of 1370 (11.3%) of the confirmed cases are among the 5-19 years category.
- Among those aged 30-39 years, a significant proportion of males, 1836 (56.0%) are infected more than females 1442 (44.0%).
- The under 5 years make up 299 (2.5%) of the total cases.
- Aged 60 years and above constitute 550 (4.5%) of the confirmed cases.




Figure 3: Age and Sex distribution of COVID-19 confirmed cases, As of 14 October 2020

PUBLIC HEALTH ACTION(S)

- Training on Integrated Disease Surveillance Response (IDSR) is ongoing country-wide.
- Public awareness on COVID-19 prevention measures is ongoing.
- The government and developmental partners continue to prioritise continuation of essential health services

CHALLENGES

- Lack of isolation units and facilities in the country for special cases in closed settings such as police holding cells and prisons.
- Inadequate ICU facilities and ICU equipment at referral hospitals and high care units in the districts.

RECOMMENDATIONS

- Establish fully equipped isolation units and facilities for identified special cases throughout the country.
- Provision of fully equipped ICU facilities at referral hospitals and high care units in the districts.
