HIGHLIGHTS/SITUATION UPDATE (22/09/2020)

- A total of 10663 cases have been recorded in a population of approximately 2.5 Million people, making it about 0.4% of the population infected.
- More male cases 5719 (53.6%) were recorded compared to female cases 4944 (46.4%).
- Of the total confirmed cases, 443 (4.2%) Health Care Workers (HCWs) have tested positive for COVID-19 to-date.
 - 296 (66.8%) State; 146 (33.0%) Private, 1 (0.2%) NGO
- Today (22/09/2020), 72 recoveries have been recorded from 6 regions; the recovery rate now stands at 79.0%.
- All fourteen (14) regions have reported confirmed cases; Khomas and Erongo regions are reporting the highest with 5063 (47.5%) and 3806 (35.7%) respectively.

EPIDEMIOLOGICAL SITUATION IN NAMIBIA




Figure 1: Epi-curve for confirmed COVID-19 cases 22 September 2020

- To date, 90841 tests (including 5140 re-tests) have been conducted by NIP, Path-Care, NAMDEB, and UNAM laboratories.
- Since the beginning of the outbreak, 22796 contacts of confirmed cases have been identified, 246 new contacts were identified within the last 24 hours from 10 regions.
- Cumulatively, 12976 contacts have completed their monitoring period, while a total of 1830 (19.3%) contacts of confirmed cases have tested positive.
- Today, 7792 (82.1%) out of 9486 active contacts were monitored.




Figure 2: Age and Sex distribution of COVID-19 confirmed cases
As of 22 September 2020

- Up to 2123 (19.9%) of the total cases were recorded during week 34 (Figure 1).
- After a peak in epi-week 34, the country has seen a gradual reduction in the mean number of confirmed cases from 303 to 94 in epi-week 38.
- Call center continues operation for 24 hours daily. Today, 1198 calls were answered including 19 alerts.

- The 20-49 years age-brackets constitute 7756 (72.7%) of the confirmed cases, while a sizable proportion of the 50-59 age group is 1123 (10.5%).
- Among those aged 30-39 years, a significant proportion of males, 1642 (55.3%) are infected more than females 1327 (44.7%).
- The under 5 years make up 250 (2.3%) of the total cases.
- Aged 60 years and above constitute 480 (4.5%) of the confirmed cases.

- Since March 2020, 13323 people have been placed into mandatory quarantine facilities around the country.
- A total of **846** people are currently in quarantine with **57** new admissions in the past 24 hours.
- A total of 337 trucks entered the country through various ground crossing points in the last 24 hours.
- Of these trucks, 130 (38.6%) were heading to Khomas, 72 (21.4%) to //Kharas while 71 (21.1%) were heading to Erongo region.
- The remaining 64 (19.0%) were heading to the other 8 regions.




Figure 3: Distribution of suspected and confirmed COVID-19 cases in Namibia by District as of 22 September 2020

PUBLIC HEALTH ACTION(S)

- Weekly engagements with regions to ensure readiness for effective response.
- Public awareness on COVID-19 prevention measures is ongoing.
- Efforts on expanding the National testing capacity are ongoing.
- Response strategies for post State of Emergency are underway.

CHALLENGES

- Large data backlog awaiting entry into excel data base and DHIS2.
- Inadequate ICU facilities and ICU equipment at referral hospitals and high care units in the districts.
- Inadequate isolation units, at health facilities in the regions.

RECOMMENDATIONS

- Fast tracking of efforts to use DHIS2 national-wide.
- Provision of fully equipped ICU facilities at referral hospitals and high care units in the districts.
- Establish fully equipped isolation units at health facilities in the regions.
