- A total of 11373 cases have been recorded in a population of approximately 2.5 Million people, making it about 0.5% of the population infected.
- More cases 6167 (54.2%) were recorded compared to female cases 5206 (44.8%).
- Of the total confirmed cases, **456** (4.0%) Health Care Workers (HCWs) have tested positive for COVID-19 to-date.
 - 300 (65.8%) State; 155 (34.0%) Private, 1 (0.2%) NGO
- Today (30/09/2020), 69 recoveries have been recorded from 5 regions; the recovery rate now stands at 79.9%.
- All fourteen (14) regions have reported confirmed cases; Khomas and Erongo regions reported the highest with 5286 (46.5%) and 3854 (33.9%) respectively.
- Of the total fatalities, 97 (78.9%) are COVID-19 deaths while 26 (21.1%) are COVID-19 related deaths.
- > There is an alarming increase in the number of COVID-19 positive cases in closed settings such as schools and police holding cells.

- Up to 2123 (18.7%) of the total cases were recorded during week 34 (Figure 1).
- After a peak in epi-week 34, the country has seen a gradual reduction in the average number of confirmed cases from 303 to 94 in epi-week 39.
- Call center continues operation for 24 hours daily. Today, 1180 calls were answered including 112 alerts.




Figure 2: Age and Sex distribution of COVID-19 confirmed cases
As of 30 September 2020

- To date, 98388 tests (including 5427 re-tests) have been conducted by NIP, Path-Care, NAMDEB, UNAM and Namib Poultry laboratories.
- Since the beginning of the outbreak, 24739 contacts of confirmed cases have been identified, 91 new contacts were identified within the last 24 hours from 12 regions.
- Cumulatively, 15304 contacts have completed their monitoring period, while a total of 2296 (23.9%) contacts of confirmed cases have tested positive.
- Today, 8128 (84.5%) out of 9619 active contacts were monitored.




Figure 1: Epi-curve for confirmed COVID-19 cases 30 September 2020

- The 20-49 years age-brackets constitute **8167** (71.8%) of the confirmed cases, while a sizable proportion of the 50-59 age group is **1178** (10.4%).
- A total of 1244 (10.9%) of the confirmed cases are among the 5-19 years category.
- Among those aged 30-39 years, a significant proportion of males, **1745** (**55.8%**) are infected more than females **1380** (**44.2%**).
- The under 5 years make up **272** (2.4%) of the total cases.
- Aged 60 years and above constitute **512** (**4.5%**) of the confirmed cases.

- Since March 2020, 14369 people have been placed into mandatory quarantine facilities around the country.
- A total of 1017 people are currently in quarantine with 46 new admissions in the past 24 hours.

PUBLIC HEALTH ACTION(S)

- Commencement of testing by Namib Poultry laboratory as part of the national testing strategy.
- The IPC simulation sessions are ongoing country-wide.
- Training on Public Health Emergency Operation Centre and Incident Management System with WHO-AFRO is ongoing.
- Public awareness on COVID-19 prevention measures is ongoing.
- Response strategies for post State of Emergency are underway.

CHALLENGES

- Large data backlog awaiting entry into excel data base and DHIS2.
- Inadequate ICU facilities and ICU equipment at referral hospitals and high care units in the districts.
