

HIGHLIGHTS/SITUATION UPDATE (13/10/2020)



TODAY Tested 1133 Active 1794 Recovered 25 Death 1

- A total of 12069 cases have been recorded in a population of approximately 2.5 Million people, making it about 0.5% of the population infected.
- More male cases 6566 (54.4%) were recorded compared to female cases 5504 (45.6%).
- Of the total confirmed cases, 478 (4.0%) Health Care Workers (HCWs) have tested positive for COVID-19 todate.
 - 309 (64.6%) State; 166 (34.7%) Private, 3 (0.6%) NGO
- Today (13/10/2020), 25 recoveries have been recorded from 3 regions region; the recovery rate now stands at 84.1%.
- All fourteen (14) regions have reported confirmed cases; Khomas and Erongo regions reported the highest with 5629 (46.6%) and 3889 (32.2%) respectively.
- Of the total fatalities, 101 (77.7%) are COVID-19 deaths while 29 (22.3%) are COVID-19 related deaths.
- There is an alarming increase in the number of COVID-19 positive cases in closed settings such as schools, police holding cells and prisons.




Figure 2: Epi-curve for confirmed COVID-19 cases, as of 13 October 2020

- Up to 2123 (17.6%) of the total cases were recorded during week 34 (Figure 2).
- After a peak in epi-week 34, the country has seen a gradual reduction in the average number of confirmed cases from 303 to 44 in epi-week 41.
- The National Call center continues operation for 24 hours daily.

Today (13/10/2020), 1005 calls were answered including 110 alerts.




Figure 1: Distribution of suspected and confirmed COVID-19 cases by District, 13 October 2020

- To date, 111361 tests (including 5877 retests) have been conducted by NIP, Path-Care, NAMDEB. **UNAM** and Namib Poultry laboratories.
- Since the beginning of the outbreak, 28653 contacts of confirmed cases have been identified, 264 new contacts were identified within the last 24 hours from 13 regions.
- Cumulatively, 21056 contacts have completed their monitoring period, while a total of 2884 (37.3%) contacts of confirmed cases have tested positive.
- Today, 7716 (99.7%) out of 7736 active contacts were monitored.




Figure 3: Age and Sex distribution of COVID-19 confirmed cases, As of 13 October 2020

- The 20-49 years age-brackets constitute 8619 (71.4%) of the confirmed cases, while a sizable proportion of the 50-59 age group is 1239 (10.3%).
- A total of 1366 (11.3%) of the confirmed cases are among the 5-19 years category.
- Among those aged 30-39 years, a significant proportion of males, 1832 (56.1%) are infected more than females 1453 (43.9%).
- The under 5 years make up 297 (2.5%) of the total cases.
- Aged 60 years and above constitute 548 (4.5%) of the confirmed cases.

- > Training on Integrated Disease Surveillance Response (IDSR) is ongoing country-wide.
- Public awareness on COVID-19 prevention measures is ongoing.
- > The government and developmental partners continue to prioritise continuation of essential health services

CHALLENGES

- Lack of isolation units and facilities in the country for special cases in closed settings such as police holding cells and prisons.
- Inadequate ICU facilities and ICU equipment at referral hospitals and high care units in the districts.

RECOMMENDATIONS

- Establish fully equipped isolation units and facilities for identified special cases throughout the country.
- Provision of fully equipped ICU facilities at referral hospitals and high care units in the districts.
