- A total of 36680 cases have been recorded to-date, representing 1% of the population.
- More male cases 18565 (51%) were recorded compared to female cases 18115 (49%).
- Of the total confirmed cases, 1699 (5%) Health Workers (HWs) have tested positive for COVID-19 to-date.
  - 1309 (77%) State; 382 (22%) Private, 4 (0.2%) Non-Governmental Organizations.
  - 1648 (97%) recoveries and 6 (0.4%) deaths.

- The recovery rate now stands at 94%.
- > All fourteen (14) regions have reported confirmed cases; Khomas and Erongo regions reported the highest with 14899 (41%) and 7239 (20%) respectively.
- Of the total fatalities, 315 (80%) are COVID-19 deaths while 79 (20%) are COVID-19 related deaths.


Table 2: Number of people in mandatory quarantine facilities

- Since March 2020, 34426 people have been placed into mandatory quarantine facilities around the country.
- A total of 2320 people are currently in quarantine, with 357 new admissions.

The National Call Center continues operations for 24 hours daily.

Today (17/02/2021), 546 calls were answered including 80 alerts.

To date, 284994 tests (including 11466 retests) have been conducted by NIP, Path-Care, NAMDEB, UNAM, Namib Poultry and

Since the beginning of the outbreak, 67177 contacts of confirmed cases have been identified, 378 new contacts were identified within the last 24 hours from 9 regions.

Central Veterinary laboratories.

- Cumulatively, 62270 contacts have completed their monitoring period, while a total of 8695 (24%) contacts of confirmed cases have tested positive.
- Today, 2143 (47%) out of 4598 active contacts monitored.




Figure 2: Age and Sex distribution of COVID-19 confirmed cases, as of 17 February 2021

- Of the total confirmed cases, 24799 (68%) are in the 20-49 years age-brackets which constitutes the majority of the recorded cases.
- A total of 4840 (13%) of the confirmed cases are among the 5-19 years category.
- The under 5 years age group make 848 (2%) of the total cases whereas, 2348 (6%) are above 60 years of age.
