HIGHLIGHTS/SITUATION UPDATE (18/03/2021)

- A total of 41965 cases have been recorded to-date, representing 2% of the population.
- More male cases 21188 (50%) were recorded compared to female cases 20777 (50%).
- Of the total confirmed cases, 1885 (4%) are Health Workers (HWs).
 - 1474 (78%) State; 403 (21%) Private, 4 (0.2%) Non-Governmental Organizations.
 - 1749 (93%) recoveries and 6 (0.3%) deaths.
- > The recovery rate now stands at 93%.
- All fourteen (14) regions have reported confirmed cases; Khomas and Erongo regions reported the highest with 15887 (38%) and 7721 (18%) respectively.
- Of the total fatalities, 390 (80%) are COVID-19 deaths while 96 (20%) are COVID-19 related deaths.

EPIDEMIOLOGICAL SITUATION IN NAMIBIA




Figure 1: Epi-curve for confirmed COVID-19 cases, 18 March 2021

- The National Call Center continues operations for 24 hours daily.
- Today (18/03/2021), 442 calls were answered including 16 alerts.




Figure 2: Age and Sex distribution of COVID-19 confirmed cases 18 March 2021

- A highest peak of 3485 (8%) cases was recorded during week 1 in 2021 (Figure 2).

- Of the total confirmed cases, 27255 (65%) are in the 20-49 years age-brackets which constitutes the majority of the recorded cases.
- A total of 6779 (16%) of the confirmed cases are among the 5-19 years category.
- ➤ The under 5 years age group make up 956 (2%) of the total cases whereas, 2650 (6%) are above 60 years of age.




Figure 3: Distribution of cumulative confirmed cases per 100 000 by region, 18 March 2021

- To date, 326354 tests (including 11700 retests) have been conducted by NIP, Path-Care, NAMDEB, UNAM, Namib Poultry, Diagno, NAMPath and Central Veterinary laboratories
- Since the beginning of the outbreak, 76440 contacts of confirmed cases have been identified, 361 new contacts were identified within the last 24 hours from 12 regions.
- Cumulatively, 71452 contacts have completed their monitoring period, while a total of 10432 (25%) contacts of confirmed cases have tested positive.
- Today, 3536 (74%) out of 4776 active contacts monitored.

- Since March 2020, 39354 people have been placed into mandatory quarantine facilities around the country.
- A total of 1890 people are currently in quarantine, with 296 new admissions.

PUBLIC HEALTH ACTION(S)

- Mechanisms are underway on how to roll out the vaccine nationwide once it is made available.
- The government and developmental partners continue to prioritise the continuation of essential health services.

CHALLENGES

- Lack of isolation units and facilities for cases detected in boarding schools.
- Non-adherence to COVID-19 prevention measures by the general public.

RECOMMENDATIONS

- Establish fully equipped isolation units and facilities for cases in schools.
- > Continue to give awareness on the importance of adhering to COVID -19 prevention measures; with the involvement of the Security Cluster.
