

- A total of 42477 cases have been recorded to-date, representing 2% of the population.
- More male cases 21461 (51%) were recorded compared to female cases 21016 (49%).
- Of the total confirmed cases, 1902 (4%) are Health Workers (HWs).
 - 1494 (79%) State; 404 (21%) Private, 4
 (0.2%) Non-Governmental Organizations.
 - 1885 (99%) recoveries and 6 (0.3%) deaths.
- The recovery rate now stands at 93%.
- All fourteen (14) regions have reported confirmed cases; Khomas and Erongo regions reported the highest with 15960 (38%) and 7798 (18%) respectively.
- Of the total fatalities, 396 (80%) are COVID-19 deaths while 96 (20%) are COVID-19 related deaths.

- Of the total confirmed cases, 27504 (65%) are in the 20-49 years age-brackets which constitutes the majority of the recorded cases.
 - A total of **6933 (16%)** of the confirmed cases are among the 5-19 years category.
 - The under 5 years age group make up 968 (2%) of the total cases whereas, 2687 (6%) are above 60 years of age.




Figure 2: Age and Sex distribution of COVID-19 confirmed cases 20 March 2021




Figure 3: Distribution of cumulative confirmed cases per 100 000 by region, 20 March 2021
