HIGHLIGHTS/SITUATION UPDATE (07/06/2021)

- A total of 59 814 cases have been recorded to-date, representing 2% of the total population (2 550 226).
- More female cases 30 573 (51%) have been recorded compared to male cases 29 241 (49%).
- Of the total confirmed cases, 2 623 (4%) are Health Workers.
- 2 096 (80%) State; 523 (20%) Private, 4 (0.2%) Non-Governmental Organizations.
- 2213 (84%) recoveries and 10 (0.4%) deaths.
- The recovery rate now stands at 88%.
- All fourteen (14) regions have reported confirmed cases; Khomas and Erongo regions reported the highest with 22 224 (37%) and 9 736 (16%) respectively.
- Of the total fatalities, 788 (84%) are COVID-19 deaths while 148 (16%) are COVID-19 related deaths. The case fatality rate now stands at 2%.

EPIDEMIOLOGICAL SITUATION IN NAMIBIA

- Of the total confirmed cases, 37 214 (62%) are in the 20-49 years age-brackets which constitutes the majority of the recorded cases.
- A total of 1 008 (17%) of the confirmed cases are among the 5-19 years category.
- The under 5 years age group make up 1 344 (2%) of the total cases whereas, 4 542 (8%) are above 60 years of age.




Figure 1: Age and Sex distribution of COVID-19 confirmed cases





Figure 2: Epi-curve for confirmed COVID-19 cases, 07 June 2021

- The highest peaks of 3 485 (6%) and 3 544 (6%) cases were recorded during week 1 and 22 of 2021 respectively (Figure 2).
- The National Call Center continues operations for 24 hours daily.
- Today (07/06/2021), 740 calls were answered including 16 alerts.

Cumulative_confirmed cases per 100 000 people




Figure 3: Distribution of cumulative confirmed cases per 100 000 by region, 07 June 2021

- To date, 449 166 tests (including 12 258 re-tests) have been conducted by NIP, Path-Care, NAMDEB, UNAM, Namib Poultry, Diagno, NAMPath, Namibia Central Pathology, High Care and Central Veterinary laboratories
- Since the beginning of the outbreak, 99 326 contacts of confirmed cases have been identified, 452 new contacts were identified within the last 24 hours from 11 regions.
- Cumulatively, 94 926 contacts have completed their monitoring period, while 118 contacts are lost to follow-up and a total of 14 463 (24%) contacts of confirmed cases have tested positive.
- Today, 961 (27%) out of 3 616 active contacts were monitored.

- Since March 2020, 51 602 people have been placed into mandatory quarantine facilities around the country.
- A total of 1 524 people are currently in quarantine, with 321 new admissions.

PUBLIC HEALTH ACTION (S)

- The COVID-19 vaccination programme is ongoing throughout the country
- > The government and development partners continue to prioritize the continuation of essential health services.

CHALLENGES

- Slow vaccine uptake among members of the public, and circulation of anti-vaccination information.
- Non-adherence to COVID-19 Infection Prevention and Control (IPC) measures by the general public.

RECOMMENDATIONS

- Encourage the public to get vaccinated, and strengthen community health awareness to counter anti-vaccination information in circulation.
- Continue to give awareness on the importance of adhering to COVID-19 IPC measures; with the involvement of the Security Cluster.
