HIGHLIGHTS/SITUATION UPDATE (13/06/2021)

- A total of **65 815** cases have been recorded to-date, representing **3%** of the total population (**2 550 226**).
- More female cases **34 018 (52%)** have been recorded compared to male cases **31 797 (48%)**.
- Of the total confirmed cases, **2 822 (4%)** are Health Workers.
- **2 250 (80%)** State; **567 (20%)** Private, **5 (0.2%)** Non-Governmental Organizations.
- **2 490 (88%)** recoveries and **10 (0.4%)** deaths.
- The recovery rate now stands at **84%**.
- All fourteen (14) regions have reported confirmed cases; **Khomas and Erongo** regions reported the highest with **25 286 (38%)** and **10 435 (16%)** respectively.
- Of the total fatalities, **853 (85%)** are COVID-19 deaths while **155 (15%)** are COVID-19 related deaths. The case fatality rate now stands at **2%**.

➤ The National Call Center continues operations for 24 hours daily.

➤ Today (13/06/2021), **804** calls were answered including **11** alerts.

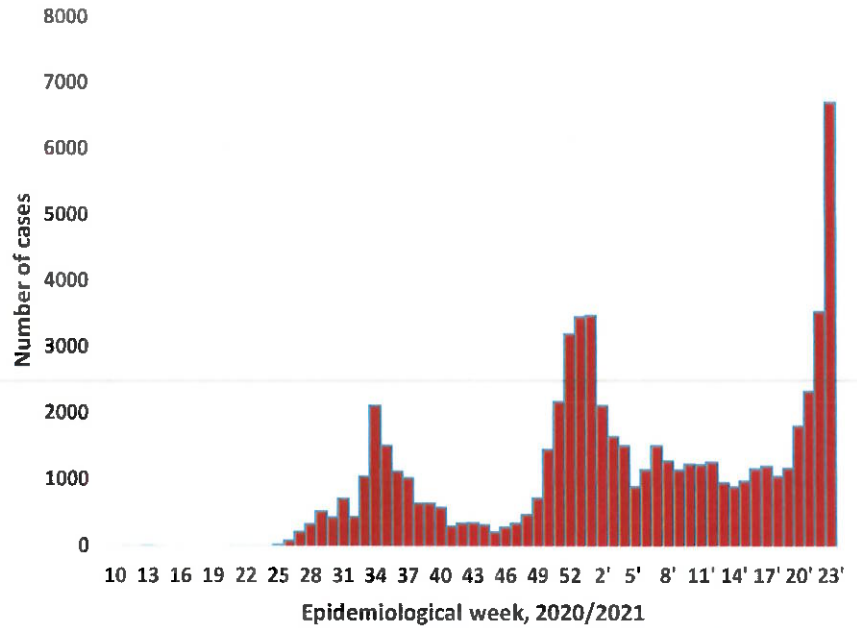


Figure 1: Epi-curve for confirmed COVID-19 cases, 13 June 2021

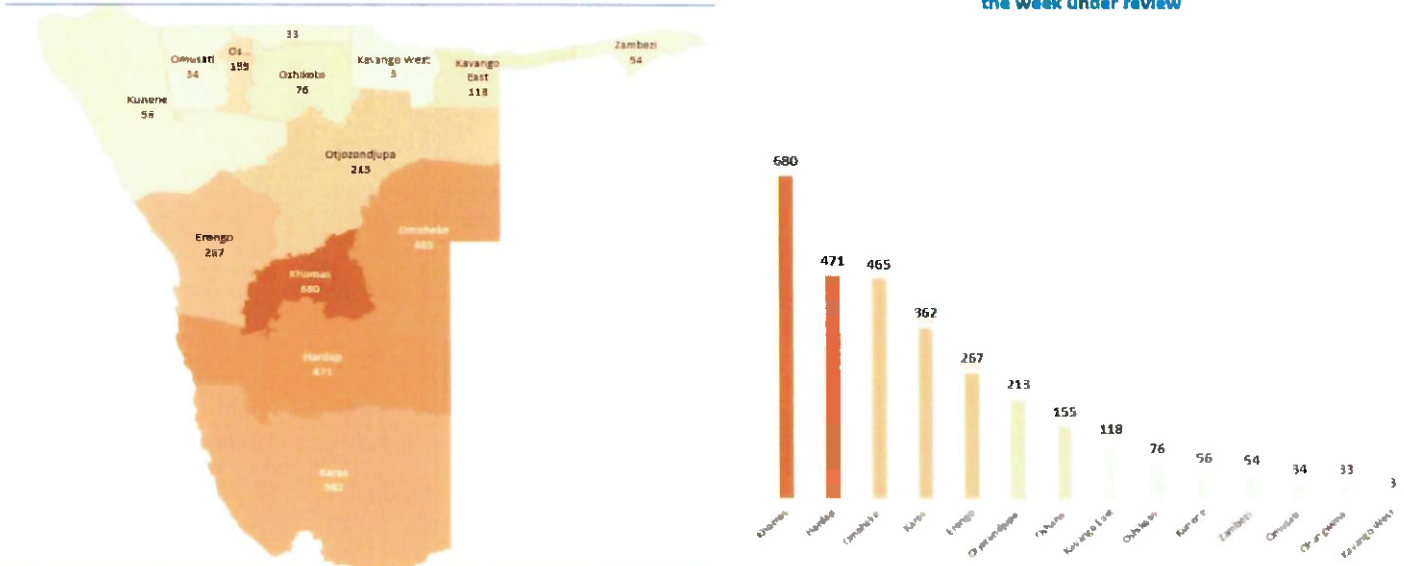


Figure 2: Distribution of cumulative confirmed cases per 100 000 by region, 13 June 2021

- Of the total confirmed cases, **40 784 (62%)** are in the 20-49 years age-brackets which constitutes the majority of the recorded cases.
- A total of **11 096 (17%)** of the confirmed cases are among the 5-19 years category.
- The under 5 years age group make up **1 470 (2%)** of the total cases whereas, **5 076 (8%)** are above 60 years of age.

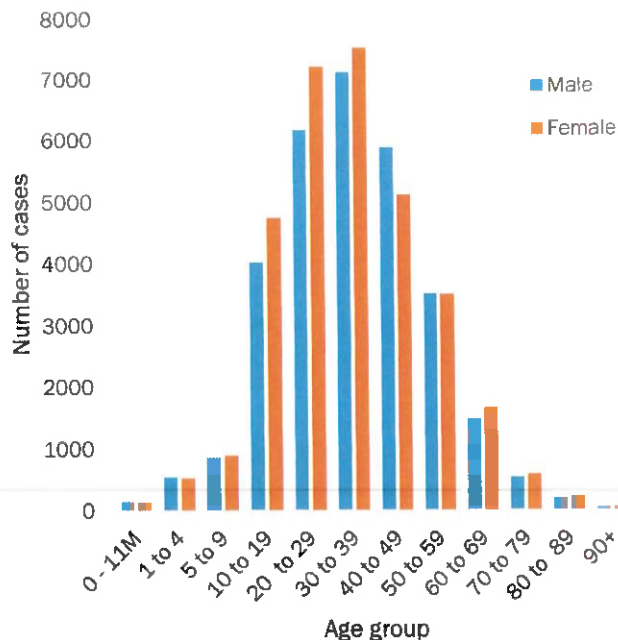


Figure 3: Age and Sex distribution of COVID-19 confirmed cases 13 June 2021

- Since March 2020, **52 937** people have been placed into mandatory quarantine facilities around the country.
- A total of **2 132** people are currently in quarantine, with **9** new admissions.

- To date, **466 361** tests (including **12 354** re-tests) have been conducted by NIP, Path-Care, NAMDEB, UNAM, Namib Poultry, Diagno, NAMPath, Namibia Central Pathology, High Care and Central Veterinary laboratories
- Since the beginning of the outbreak, **102 082** contacts of confirmed cases have been identified, **120** new contacts were identified within the last 24 hours from 12 regions.
- Cumulatively, **96 680** contacts have completed their monitoring period, while **134** contacts are lost to follow-up and a total of **15 293 (23%)** contacts of confirmed cases have tested positive.
- Today, **1 299 (28%)** out of **4 607** active contacts were monitored.

PUBLIC HEALTH ACTION (S)

- The COVID-19 vaccination programme is ongoing throughout the country
- The government and development partners continue to prioritize the continuation of essential health services.

CHALLENGES

- Non-adherence to COVID-19 Infection Prevention and Control (IPC) measures by the general public.

RECOMMENDATIONS

- Continue to give awareness on the importance of adhering to COVID-19 IPC measures; with the involvement of the Security Cluster.
