- A total of 71 761 cases have been recorded to-date, representing 3% of the total population (2 550 226).
- More female cases 37 348 (52%) have been recorded compared to male cases 34 413 (48%).
- Of the total confirmed cases, 2 955 (4%) are Health Workers.
- 2 365 (80%) State; 585 (20%) Private, 5 (0.2%) Non-Governmental Organizations.
- 2 490 (84%) recoveries and 10 (0.3%) deaths.
- The recovery rate now stands at 82%.
- All fourteen (14) regions have reported confirmed cases; Khomas and Erongo regions reported the highest with 27 875 (39%) and 11 106 (15%) respectively.
- Of the total fatalities, 962 (85%) are COVID-19 deaths while 172 (15%) are COVID-19 related deaths. The case fatality rate now stands at 2%.

EPIDEMIOLOGICAL SITUATION IN NAMIBIA




Figure 1: Epi-curve for confirmed COVID-19 cases, 17 June 2021

- The highest peak of 6 723 (9%) cases was recorded during week 23'of 2021 (Figure 1).
- The National Call Center continues operations for 24 hours daily.
- Today (17/06/2021), 863 calls were answered including 10 alerts.




Figure 2: Distribution of cumulative confirmed cases per 100 000 by region, 17 June 2021

- Of the total confirmed cases, 44 312 (62%) are in the 20-49 years age-brackets which constitutes the majority of the recorded cases.
- A total of 12 172 (17%) of the confirmed cases are among the 5-19 years category.
- The under 5 years age group make up 1 562 (2%) of the total cases whereas, 5 606 (8%) are above 60 years of age.




Figure 3: Age and Sex distribution of COVID-19 confirmed cases 17 June 2021

- Since March 2020, 55 488 people have been placed into mandatory quarantine facilities around the country.
- A total of 3 047 people are currently in quarantine, with 406 new admissions.

- To date, 483 175 tests (including 12 503 retests) have been conducted by Alpha Medical Centre, NIP, Path-Care, NAMDEB, UNAM, Namib Poultry, Diagno, NAMPath, Namibia Central Pathology, High Care, and Central Veterinary laboratories
- Since the beginning of the outbreak, 104 584 contacts of confirmed cases have been identified, 354 new contacts were identified within the last 24 hours from 12 regions.
- Cumulatively, 98 743 contacts have completed their monitoring period, while 134 contacts are lost to follow-up and a total of 15 640 (22%) contacts of confirmed cases have tested positive.
- Today, 3 524 (69%) out of 5 073 active contacts were monitored.

PUBLIC HEALTH ACTION (S)

- His Excellency the President has announced an amendment of COVID-19 response measures to be effective from today until 30 June 2021.
- The COVID-19 vaccination programme is ongoing throughout the country
- The government and development partners continue to prioritize the continuation of essential health services.

CHALLENGES

Non-adherence to COVID-19 Infection Prevention and Control (IPC) measures by the general public.
