

- A total of 73 164 cases have been recorded to-date, representing 3% of the total population (2 550 226).
- More female cases 38 139 (52%) have been recorded compared to male cases 35 025 (48%).
- Of the total confirmed cases, 2 976 (4%) are Health Workers.
 - 2 386 (80%) State; 585 (20%) Private, 5 (0.2%) Non-Governmental Organizations.
 - 2 490 (84%) recoveries and 10 (0.3%) deaths.
- The recovery rate now stands at 80%.
- All fourteen (14) regions have reported confirmed cases; Khomas and Erongo regions reported the highest with 28 443 (38%) and 11 270 (15%) respectively.
- Of the total fatalities, 986 (85%) are COVID-19 deaths while 175 (15%) are COVID-19 related deaths. The case fatality rate now stands at 2%.




Figure 2: Distribution of cumulative confirmed cases per 100 000 by region, 18 June 2021

- Of the total confirmed cases, 45 179 (62%) are in the 20-49 years age-brackets which constitutes the majority of the recorded cases.
- A total of 12 371 (17%) of the confirmed cases are among the 5-19 years category.
- The under 5 years age group make up 1 587 (2%) of the total cases whereas, 5 764 (8%) are above 60 years of age.




Figure 3: Age and Sex distribution of COVID-19 confirmed cases

- Since March 2020, 56 080 people have been placed into mandatory quarantine facilities around the country.
- A total of 3 385 people are currently in quarantine, with 592 new admissions.

- The laboratory testing capacity has been enhanced; with a total of thirteen (13) laboratories carrying out the testing of samples: NIP (including Oshakati), Path-Care, UNAM Molecular, Central Veterinary Laboratory, Namib Poultry, NAMDEB Molecular, NamPath, Namibia Central Pathology, DiagnoLab, High Care, Alpha Medical Laboratory, Des-Jo Medical Test Centre and ProQuest Diagnostic Laboratory.
- To date, 486 744 tests (including 12 534 re-tests) have been conducted by authorized laboratories.
- Since the beginning of the outbreak, 105 186 contacts of confirmed cases have been identified, 602 new contacts were identified within the last 24 hours from 7 regions.
- Cumulatively, 99 502 contacts have completed their monitoring period, while 134 contacts are lost to follow-up and a total of 15 713 (21%) contacts of confirmed cases have tested positive.
- Today, 1 131 (23%) out of 4 851 active contacts were monitored.

PUBLIC HEALTH ACTION (S)

- > The COVID-19 vaccination programme is ongoing throughout the country
- > The government and development partners continue to prioritize the continuation of essential health services.

CHALLENGES

- High infection rate countrywide.
- Non-adherence to COVID-19 Infection Prevention and Control (IPC) measures by the general public.

RECOMMENDATIONS

- Continue to encourage the public to take the vaccine to increase herd immunity.
- Continue to give awareness on the importance of adhering to COVID-19 IPC measures; with the involvement of the Security Cluster.
