- A total of 74 682 cases have been recorded to-date, representing 3% of the total population (2 550 226).
- More female cases 38 993 (52%) have been recorded compared to male cases 35 689 (48%).
- Of the total confirmed cases, 3 005 (4%) are Health Workers.
  - 2 413 (80%) State; 587 (20%) Private, 5 (0.2%) Non-Governmental Organizations.
  - 2 490 (83%) recoveries and 10 (0.3%) deaths.
- The recovery rate now stands at 80%.
- All fourteen (14) regions have reported confirmed cases; Khomas and Erongo regions reported the highest with 29 370 (39%) and 11 526 (15%) respectively.
- Of the total fatalities, 988 (85%) are COVID-19 deaths while 176 (15%) are COVID-19 related deaths. The case fatality rate now stands at 2%.

- Today (19/06/2021), **791** calls were answered including **9** alerts.




Figure 1: Epi-curve for confirmed COVID-19 cases, 19 June 2021

Figure 2: Distribution of cumulative confirmed cases per 100 000 by region, 19 June 2021

- Of the total confirmed cases, 46 098 (62%) are in the 20-49 years age-brackets which constitutes the majority of the recorded cases.
- A total of 12 623 (17%) of the confirmed cases are among the 5-19 years category.
- The under 5 years age group make up 1 610 (2%) of the total cases whereas, 5 899 (8%) are above 60 years of age.




Figure 3: Age and Sex distribution of COVID-19 confirmed cases

- Since March 2020, 56 257 people have been placed into mandatory quarantine facilities around the country.
- A total of 3 412 people are currently in quarantine, with 177 new admissions.

- > The laboratory testing capacity has been enhanced; with a total of thirteen (13) laboratories carrying out the testing of samples: NIP (including Oshakati), Path-Care, UNAM Molecular, Central Veterinary Laboratory, Namib Poultry, NAMDEB Molecular, NamPath, Namibia Central Pathology, DiagnoLab, High Care, Alpha Medical Laboratory, Des-Jo Medical Test Centre and ProQuest Diagnostic Laboratory.
- To date, 490 538 tests (including 12 553 re-tests) have been conducted by authorized laboratories.
- Since the beginning of the outbreak, 105 425 contacts of confirmed cases have been identified, 239 new contacts were identified within the last 24 hours from 7 regions.
- Cumulatively, 99 664 contacts have completed their monitoring period, while 134 contacts are lost to follow-up and a total of 15 725 (21%) contacts of confirmed cases have tested positive.
- Today, 4 627 (94%) out of 4 929 active contacts were monitored.

## PUBLIC HEALTH ACTION (S)

- The COVID-19 vaccination programme is ongoing throughout the country
- The government and development partners continue to prioritize the continuation of essential health services.

## CHALLENGES

- High infection rate countrywide.
- Non-adherence to COVID-19 Infection Prevention and Control (IPC) measures by the general public.

## RECOMMENDATIONS


- Continue to encourage the public to take the vaccine to increase herd immunity.
