HIGHLIGHTS/SITUATION UPDATE (20/06/2021)



- A total of 75 766 cases have been recorded to-date, representing 3% of the total population (2 550 226).
- More female cases 39 641 (52%) have been recorded compared to male cases 35 125 (48%).
- Of the total confirmed cases, 3 018 (4%) are Health Workers.
 - 2 426 (80%) State; 587 (19%) Private, 5 (0.2%) Non-Governmental Organizations.
 - 2 490 (83%) recoveries and 10 (0.3%) deaths.
- The recovery rate now stands at 80%.
- All fourteen (14) regions have reported confirmed cases; Khomas and Erongo regions reported the highest with 29 586 (39%) and 11 680 (15%) respectively.
- Of the total fatalities, 1 002 (85%) are COVID-19 deaths while 177 (15%) are COVID-19 related deaths. The case fatality rate now stands at 2%.




Figure 2: Distribution of cumulative confirmed cases per 100 000 by region, 20 June 2021

- Of the total confirmed cases, 46 695 (62%) are in the 20-49 years age-brackets which constitutes the majority of the recorded cases.
- A total of 12 868 (17%) of the confirmed cases are among the 5-19 years category.
- The under 5 years age group make up 1 629 (2%) of the total cases whereas, 5 996 (8%) are above 60 years of age.




Figure 3: Age and Sex distribution of COVID-19 confirmed cases

- Since March 2020, 56 401 people have been placed into mandatory quarantine facilities around the country.
- A total of 3 404 people are currently in quarantine, with 144 new admissions.

- The laboratory testing capacity has been enhanced; with a total of thirteen (13) laboratories carrying out the testing of samples: NIP (including Oshakati), Path-Care, UNAM Molecular, Central Veterinary Laboratory, Namib Poultry, NAMDEB Molecular, NamPath, Namibia Central Pathology, DiagnoLab, High Care, Alpha Medical Laboratory, Des-Jo Medical Test Centre and ProQuest Diagnostic Laboratory.
- To date, 493 135 tests (including 12 558 re-tests) have been conducted by authorized laboratories.
- Since the beginning of the outbreak, 106 091 contacts of confirmed cases have been identified, 666 new contacts were identified within the last 24 hours from 13 regions.
- Cumulatively, 99 784 contacts have completed their monitoring period, while 134 contacts are lost to follow-up and a total of 15 762 (21%) contacts of confirmed cases have tested positive.
- Today, 1 454 (28%) out of 5 262 active contacts were monitored.

PUBLIC HEALTH ACTION (S)

- > The COVID-19 vaccination programme is ongoing throughout the country
- > The government and development partners continue to prioritize the continuation of essential health services.

CHALLENGES

- Non-adherence to COVID-19 Infection Prevention and Control (IPC) measures by the general public.
- High infection rate countrywide.

RECOMMENDATIONS

- Continue to give awareness on the importance of adhering to COVID-19 IPC measures; with the involvement of the Security Cluster.
- Continue to encourage the public to take the vaccine to increase herd immunity.
