HIGHLIGHTS/SITUATION UPDATE (24/06/2021)

- A total of 83 698 cases have been recorded to-date, representing 3% of the total population (2 550 226).
- More female cases 43 778 (52%) have been recorded compared to male cases 39 920 (48%).
- Of the total confirmed cases, 3 156 (4%) are Health Workers.
 - 2 554 (81%) State; 596 (19%) Private, 6 (0.2%) Non-Governmental Organizations.
 - 2 490 (79%) recoveries and 10 (0.3%) deaths.
- The recovery rate now stands at 76%.
- All fourteen (14) regions have reported confirmed cases; Khomas and Erongo regions reported the highest with 33 504 (40%) and 12 444 (15%) respectively.
- Of the total fatalities, 1 161 (86%) are COVID-19 deaths while 184 (14%) are COVID-19 related deaths. The case fatality rate now stands at 2%.

- Today (24/06/2021), 690 calls were answered including 9 alerts.




Figure 1: Epi-curve for confirmed COVID-19 cases, 24 June 2021

Figure 2: Distribution of cumulative confirmed cases per 100 000 by region, 24 June 2021

- Of the total confirmed cases, 51 276 (61%) are in the 20-49 years age-brackets which constitutes the majority of the recorded cases.
- A total of 14 151 (17%) of the confirmed cases are among the 5-19 years category.
- The under 5 years age group make up 1 784 (2%) of the total cases whereas, 6 825 (8%) are above 60 years of age.




Figure 3: Age and Sex distribution of COVID-19 confirmed cases

- Since March 2020, 57 987 people have been placed into mandatory quarantine facilities around the country.
- A total of 4 126 people are currently in quarantine, with 279 new admissions.

- The laboratory testing capacity has been enhanced; with a total of thirteen (13) laboratories carrying out the testing of samples: NIP (including Oshakati), Path-Care, UNAM Molecular, Central Veterinary Laboratory, Namib Poultry, NAMDEB Molecular, NamPath, Namibia Central Pathology, DiagnoLab, High Care, Alpha Medical Laboratory, Des-Jo Medical Test Centre and ProQuest Diagnostic Laboratory.
- To date, 510 212 tests (including 12 745 re-tests) have been conducted by authorized laboratories.
- Since the beginning of the outbreak, 109 298 contacts of confirmed cases have been identified,
 644 new contacts were identified within the last 24 hours from 12 regions.
- Cumulatively, 101 597 contacts have completed their monitoring period, while 134 contacts are lost to follow-up and a total of 16 335 (20%) contacts of confirmed cases have tested positive.
- Today, 2 481 (36%) out of 6 848 active contacts were monitored.

PUBLIC HEALTH ACTION (S)

- The COVID-19 vaccination programme is ongoing throughout the country
- The government and development partners continue to prioritize the continuation of essential health services.

CHALLENGES

- Non-adherence to COVID-19 Infection Prevention and Control (IPC) measures by the general public.
- High infection rate countrywide.

RECOMMENDATIONS

- Continue to give awareness on the importance of adhering to COVID-19 IPC measures; with the involvement of the Security Cluster.
- Continue to encourage the public to take the vaccine to increase herd immunity.
