HIGHLIGHTS/SITUATION UPDATE (25/06/2021)

- A total of **84 705** cases have been recorded to-date, representing **3%** of the total population (**2 550 226**).
- More female cases **44 341 (52%)** have been recorded compared to male cases **40 364 (48%)**.
- Of the total confirmed cases, **3 192 (4%)** are Health Workers.
 - 2 589 (81%) State; 597 (19%) Private, 6 (0.2%) Non-Governmental Organizations.
 - 2 490 (78%) recoveries and 10 (0.3%) deaths.
- The recovery rate now stands at **75%**.
- All fourteen (14) regions have reported confirmed cases; **Khomas and Erongo** regions reported the highest with **33 981 (40%)** and **12 549 (15%)** respectively.
- Of the total fatalities, **1 214 (87%)** are COVID-19 deaths while **186 (13%)** are COVID-19 related deaths. The case fatality rate now stands at **2%**.

 ➤ Today (25/06/2021), **529** calls were answered including **7** alerts.

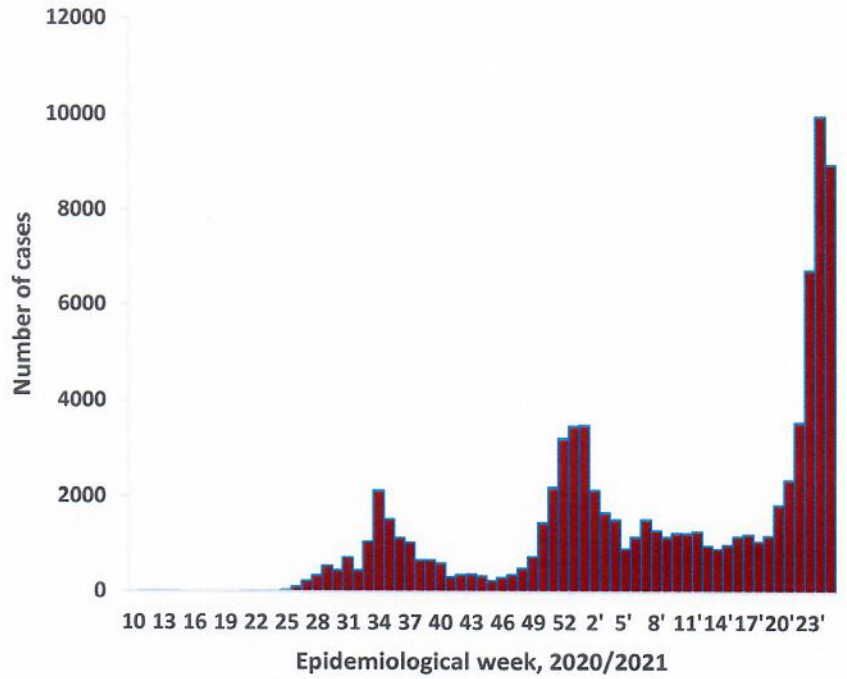


Figure 1: Epi-curve for confirmed COVID-19 cases, 25 June 2021

Figure 2: Distribution of cumulative confirmed cases per 100 000 by region, 25 June 2021

- Of the total confirmed cases, **51 830 (61%)** are in the 20-49 years age-brackets which constitutes the majority of the recorded cases.
- A total of **14 374 (17%)** of the confirmed cases are among the 5-19 years category.
- The under 5 years age group make up **1 809 (2%)** of the total cases whereas, **6 895 (8%)** are above 60 years of age.

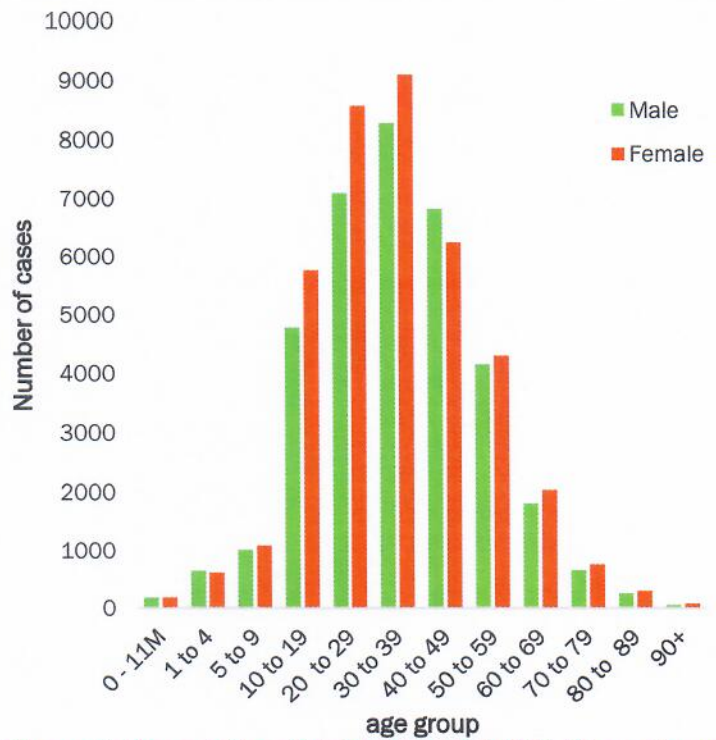


Figure 3: Age and Sex distribution of COVID-19 confirmed cases 25 June 2021

- Since March 2020, **58 375** people have been placed into mandatory quarantine facilities around the country.
- A total of **4 053** people are currently in quarantine, with **388** new admissions.

- The laboratory testing capacity has been enhanced; with a total of thirteen (13) laboratories carrying out the testing of samples: NIP (including Oshakati), Path-Care, UNAM Molecular, Central Veterinary Laboratory, Namib Poultry, NAMDEB Molecular, NamPath, Namibia Central Pathology, DiagnoLab, High Care, Alpha Medical Laboratory, Des-Jo Medical Test Centre and ProQuest Diagnostic Laboratory.
- To date, **513 554** tests (including **12 772** re-tests) have been conducted by authorized laboratories.
- Since the beginning of the outbreak, **109 912** contacts of confirmed cases have been identified, **472** new contacts were identified within the last 24 hours from 10 regions.
- Cumulatively, **102 069** contacts have completed their monitoring period, while **134** contacts are lost to follow-up and a total of **16 499 (19%)** contacts of confirmed cases have tested positive.
- Today, **4 878 (69%)** out of **7 032** active contacts were monitored.

PUBLIC HEALTH ACTION (S)

- The COVID-19 vaccination programme is ongoing throughout the country
- The government and development partners continue to prioritize the continuation of essential health services.

CHALLENGES

- Non-adherence to COVID-19 Infection Prevention and Control (IPC) measures by the general public.
- High infection rate countrywide.


RECOMMENDATIONS
