- A total of 91 208 cases have been recorded to-date, representing 4% of the total population (2 550 226).
- More female cases 48 002 (53%) have been recorded compared to male cases 43 206 (47%).
- Of the total confirmed cases, 3 334 (4%) are Health Workers.
 - 2 725 (82%) State; 603 (18%) Private, 6 (0.2%) Non-Governmental Organizations.
 - 2 928 (89%) recoveries and 11 (0.3%) deaths.
- The recovery rate now stands at 74%.
- All fourteen (14) regions have reported confirmed cases; Khomas and Erongo regions reported the highest with 35 821 (39%) and 13 506 (15%) respectively.
- Of the total fatalities, 1 368 (88%) are COVID-19 deaths while 188 (12%) are COVID-19 related deaths. The case fatality rate now stands at 2%.




Figure 1: Age and Sex distribution of COVID-19 confirmed cases 29 June 2021

- Of the total confirmed cases, 55 743 (61%) are in the 20-49 years age-brackets which constitutes the majority of the recorded cases.
- A total of 15 356 (17%) of the confirmed cases are among the 5-19 years category.
- The under 5 years age group make up 1 924 (2%) of the total cases whereas, 7 570 (8%) are above 60 years of age.







Figure 2: Distribution of cumulative confirmed cases per 100 000 by region, 29 June 2021

- Since March 2020, 60 453 people have been placed into mandatory quarantine facilities around the country.
- A total of 4 317 people are currently in quarantine, with 862 new admissions.

- The laboratory testing capacity has been enhanced; with a total of thirteen (13) laboratories carrying out the testing of samples: NIP (including Oshakati), Path-Care, UNAM Molecular, Central Veterinary Laboratory, Namib Poultry, NAMDEB Molecular, NamPath, Namibia Central Pathology, DiagnoLab, High Care, Alpha Medical Laboratory, Des-Jo Medical Test Centre and ProQuest Diagnostic Laboratory.
- To date, 528 655 tests (including 12 917 re-tests) have been conducted by authorized laboratories.
- Since the beginning of the outbreak, 112 388 contacts of confirmed cases have been identified, 919 new contacts were identified within the last 24 hours from 14 regions.
- Cumulatively, 104 212 contacts have completed their monitoring period, while 134 contacts are lost to follow-up and a total of 16 930 (19%) contacts of confirmed cases have tested positive.
- Today, 3 868 (51%) out of 7 531 active contacts were monitored.

PUBLIC HEALTH ACTION (S)

- The COVID-19 Antigen-based Diagnostic Test training is ongoing countrywide.
- The COVID-19 vaccination programme is ongoing throughout the country
- The government and development partners continue to prioritize the continuation of essential health services.

CHALLENGES

- Non-adherence to COVID-19 Infection Prevention and Control (IPC) measures by the general public.
- High infection rate countrywide.

RECOMMENDATIONS

- Continue to give awareness on the importance of adhering to COVID-19 IPC measures; with the involvement of the Security Cluster.
- Continue to encourage the public to take the vaccine to increase herd immunity.


