# **HIGHLIGHTS/SITUATION UPDATE (30/06/2021)**

## New regulations enforce (01 July 2021-15 July 2021):

- Restriction of movement extended to all regions.
- Public gatherings to be maintained at ten (10) persons per event.
- Curfew to remain in force countrywide (21h00 to 04h00).

- A total of 92 869 cases have been recorded to-date, representing 4% of the total population (2 550 226).
- More female cases 48 955 (53%) have been recorded compared to male cases 43 914 (47%).
- Of the total confirmed cases, 3 372 (4%) are Health Workers.
  - 2 753 (82%) State; 613 (18%) Private, 6 (0.2%) Non-Governmental Organizations.
  - 2 928 (87%) recoveries and 11 (0.3%) deaths.
- The recovery rate now stands at 74%.
- All fourteen (14) regions have reported confirmed cases; Khomas and Erongo regions reported the highest with 36 387 (39%) and 13 691 (15%) respectively.
- Of the total fatalities, 1 396 (88%) are COVID-19 deaths while 190 (12%) are COVID-19 related deaths. The case fatality rate now stands at 2%.




Figure 1: Age and Sex distribution of COVID-19 confirmed cases 30 June 2021

- of the total confirmed cases, 56 656 (61%) are in the 20-49 years age-brackets which constitutes the majority of the recorded cases.
- A total of **15 631 (17%)** of the confirmed cases are among the 5-19 years category.
- The under 5 years age group make up 1 955 (2%) of the total cases whereas, 7 763 (8%) are above 60 years of age.




Figure 2: Distribution of cumulative confirmed cases per 100 000 by region, 30 June 2021

- ➤ The National Call Center continues operations for 24 hours daily.
- Today (30/06/2021), 640 calls were answered including 9 alerts.




Figure 3: Epi-curve for confirmed COVID-19 cases, 30 June 2021

- Since March 2020, 61 043 people have been placed into mandatory quarantine facilities around the country.
- A total of 4 540 people are currently in quarantine, with 590 new admissions.

- The laboratory testing capacity has been enhanced; with a total of thirteen (13) laboratories carrying out the testing of samples: NIP (including Oshakati), Path-Care, UNAM Molecular, Central Veterinary Laboratory, Namib Poultry, NAMDEB Molecular, NamPath, Namibia Central Pathology, DiagnoLab, High Care, Alpha Medical Laboratory, Des-Jo Medical Test Centre and ProQuest Diagnostic Laboratory.
- To date, 532 281 tests (including 12 959 re-tests) have been conducted by authorized laboratories.
- Since the beginning of the outbreak, 113 399 contacts of confirmed cases have been identified, 1 011 new contacts were identified within the last 24 hours from 12 regions.
- Cumulatively, 105 025 contacts have completed their monitoring period, while 134 contacts are lost to follow-up and a total of 17 137 (18%) contacts of confirmed cases have tested positive.
- Today, 4 289 (55%) out of 7 729 active contacts were monitored.

### **PUBLIC HEALTH ACTION (S)**

- His Excellency the President has announced an amendment of COVID-19 response measures to be effective from 01 July 2021 until 15 July 2021.
- The COVID-19 Antigen-based Diagnostic Test training is ongoing countrywide.
- The COVID-19 vaccination programme is ongoing throughout the country
- The government and development partners continue to prioritize the continuation of essential health services.

#### **CHALLENGES**

- Non-adherence to COVID-19 Infection Prevention and Control (IPC) measures by the general public.
- High infection rate countrywide.

#### RECOMMENDATIONS

- Continue to give awareness on the importance of adhering to COVID-19 IPC measures; with the involvement of the Security Cluster.
- Continue to encourage the public to take the vaccine to increase herd immunity.
