HIGHLIGHTS/SITUATION UPDATE (01/07/2021)

New regulations enforce (01 July 2021-15 July 2021):

- Restriction of movement extended to all regions.
- Public gatherings to be maintained at ten (10) persons per event.
- Curfew to remain in force countrywide (21h00 to 04h00).

- A total of 94 047 cases have been recorded to-date, representing 4% of the total population (2 550 226).
- More female cases 49 348 (52%) have been recorded compared to male cases 44 699 (48%).
- Of the total confirmed cases, 3 400 (4%) are Health Workers.
 - 2 778 (82%) State; 616 (18%) Private, 6 (0.2%) Non-Governmental Organizations.
 - 2 928 (86%) recoveries and 11 (0.3%) deaths.
- The recovery rate now stands at 74%.
- All fourteen (14) regions have reported confirmed cases; Khomas and Erongo regions reported the highest with 36 622 (39%) and 14 024 (15%) respectively.
- Of the total fatalities, 1 435 (88%) are COVID-19 deaths while 191 (12%) are COVID-19 related deaths. The case fatality rate now stands at 2%.





Figure 1: Age and Sex distribution of COVID-19 confirmed cases 01 July 2021

- of the total confirmed cases, 57 395 (61%) are in the 20-49 years age-brackets which constitutes the majority of the recorded cases.
- A total of **15 823 (17%)** of the confirmed cases are among the 5-19 years category.
- The under 5 years age group make up 1 978 (2%) of the total cases whereas, 7 866 (8%) are above 60 years of age.





Figure 2: Distribution of cumulative confirmed cases per 100 000 by region, 01 July 2021

- Since March 2020, 61 507 people have been placed into mandatory quarantine facilities around the country.
- A total of 4 191 people are currently in quarantine, with 464 new admissions.

- The laboratory testing capacity has been enhanced; with a total of thirteen (13) laboratories carrying out the testing of samples: NIP (including Oshakati), Path-Care, UNAM Molecular, Central Veterinary Laboratory, Namib Poultry, NAMDEB Molecular, NamPath, Namibia Central Pathology, DiagnoLab, High Care, Alpha Medical Laboratory, Des-Jo Medical Test Centre and ProQuest Diagnostic Laboratory.
- To date, 535 495 tests (including 12 992 re-tests) have been conducted by authorized laboratories.
- Since the beginning of the outbreak, 113 961 contacts of confirmed cases have been identified, 562 new contacts were identified within the last 24 hours from 13 regions.
- Cumulatively, 105 782 contacts have completed their monitoring period, while 134 contacts are lost to follow-up and a total of 17 330 (18%) contacts of confirmed cases have tested positive.
- Today, 3 938 (52%) out of 7 504 active contacts were monitored.

PUBLIC HEALTH ACTION (S)

- ➤ His Excellency the President has announced an amendment of COVID-19 response measures to be effective from today until 15 July 2021.
- The COVID-19 Antigen-based Diagnostic Test training is ongoing countrywide.
- > The COVID-19 vaccination programme is ongoing throughout the country
- The government and development partners continue to prioritize the continuation of essential health services.

CHALLENGES

- Non-adherence to COVID-19 Infection Prevention and Control (IPC) measures by the general public.
- High infection rate countrywide.

RECOMMENDATIONS

- Continue to give awareness on the importance of adhering to COVID-19 IPC measures; with the involvement of the Security Cluster.
- Continue to encourage the public to take the vaccine to increase herd immunity.
