- A total of 95 703 cases have been recorded to-date, representing 4% of the total population (2 550 226).
- More female cases 50 245 (52%) have been recorded compared to male cases 45 458 (48%).
- Of the total confirmed cases, 3 403 (4%) are Health Workers.
 - 2 781 (82%) State; 616 (18%) Private, 6 (0.2%) Non-Governmental Organizations.
 - 2 928 (86%) recoveries and 11 (0.3%) deaths.
- The recovery rate now stands at 74%.
- All fourteen (14) regions have reported confirmed cases; Khomas and Erongo regions reported the highest with 37 190 (39%) and 14 079 (15%) respectively.
- > Of the total fatalities, 1 457 (88%) are COVID-19 deaths while 192 (12%) are COVID-19 related deaths. The case fatality rate now stands at 2%.





Figure 1: Age and Sex distribution of COVID-19 confirmed cases 02 July 2021

- Of the total confirmed cases, 58 390 (61%) are in the 20-49 years age-brackets which constitutes the majority of the recorded cases.
- A total of 16 069 (17%) of the confirmed cases are among the 5-19 years category.
- The under 5 years age group make up 2 011 (2%) of the total cases whereas, 8 049 (8%) are above 60 years of age.





Figure 2: Distribution of cumulative confirmed cases per 100 000 by region, 02 July 2021

- Since March 2020, 61 808 people have been placed into mandatory quarantine facilities around the country.
- A total of 4 369 people are currently in quarantine, with 301 new admissions.

- The laboratory testing capacity has been enhanced; with a total of thirteen (13) laboratories carrying out the testing of samples: NIP (including Oshakati), Path-Care, UNAM Molecular, Central Veterinary Laboratory, Namib Poultry, NAMDEB Molecular, NamPath, Namibia Central Pathology, DiagnoLab, High Care, Alpha Medical Laboratory, Des-Jo Medical Test Centre and ProQuest Diagnostic Laboratory.
- To date, 539 104 tests (including 13 025 re-tests) have been conducted by authorized laboratories.
- Since the beginning of the outbreak, 114 612 contacts of confirmed cases have been identified, 651 new contacts were identified within the last 24 hours from 7 regions.
- Cumulatively, 106 410 contacts have completed their monitoring period, while 134 contacts are lost to follow-up and a total of 17 577 (18%) contacts of confirmed cases have tested positive.
- Today, 3 961 (53%) out of 7 527 active contacts were monitored.

PUBLIC HEALTH ACTION (S)

- The COVID-19 vaccination programme is ongoing throughout the country
- > The government and development partners continue to prioritize the continuation of essential health services.

CHALLENGES

- Non-adherence to COVID-19 Infection Prevention and Control (IPC) measures by the general public.
- High infection rate countrywide.

RECOMMENDATIONS

- Continue to give awareness on the importance of adhering to COVID-19 IPC measures; with the involvement of the Security Cluster.
- Continue to encourage the public to take the vaccine to increase herd immunity.




