

HIGHLIGHTS/SITUATION UPDATE (05/07/2021)



- A total of 99 808 cases have been recorded to-date, representing 4% of the total population (2 550 226).
- More female cases 52 473 (53%) have been recorded compared to male cases 47 335 (47%).
- Of the total confirmed cases, 3 505 (4%) are Health Workers.
 - 2 877 (82%) State; 622 (18%) Private, 6 (0.2%) Non-Governmental Organizations.
 - 3 236 (92%) recoveries and 12 (0.3%) deaths.
- The recovery rate now stands at 75%.
- All fourteen (14) regions have reported confirmed cases; Khomas and Erongo regions reported the highest with 37 895 (38%) and 14 788 (15%) respectively.
- Of the total fatalities, 1 546 (88%) are COVID-19 deaths while 196 (12%) are COVID-19 related deaths. The case fatality rate now stands at 2%.

[➤] Today (05/07/2021), 590 calls were answered including 9 alerts.




Figure 1: Epi-curve for confirmed COVID-19 cases, 05 July 2021

- The laboratory testing capacity has been enhanced; with a total of thirteen (13) laboratories carrying out the testing of samples: NIP (including Oshakati), Path-Care, UNAM Molecular, Central Veterinary Laboratory, Namib Poultry, NAMDEB Molecular, NamPath, Namibia Central Pathology, DiagnoLab, High Care, Alpha Medical Laboratory, Des-Jo Medical Test Centre and ProQuest Diagnostic Laboratory.
- To date, 549 428 tests (including 13 150 re-tests) have been conducted by authorized laboratories.
- Since the beginning of the outbreak, 116 378 contacts of confirmed cases have been identified,
 808 new contacts were identified within the last 24 hours from 13 regions.
- Cumulatively, 108 041 contacts have completed their monitoring period, while 134 contacts are lost to follow-up and a total of 18 291 (18%) contacts of confirmed cases have tested positive.
- Today, 2 218 (29%) out of 7 630 active contacts were monitored.

- Since March 2020, 62 704 people have been placed into mandatory quarantine facilities around the country.
- A total of 4 104 people are currently in quarantine, with 643 new admissions.

- Of the total confirmed cases, 60 780 (61%) are in the 20-49 years age-brackets which constitutes the majority of the recorded cases.
- A total of 16 741 (17%) of the confirmed cases are among the 5-19 years category.
- The under 5 years age group make up 2 083 (2%) of the total cases whereas, 8 545 (9%) are above 60 years of age.




Figure 2: Age and Sex distribution of COVID-19 confirmed cases
