A total of 104 099 cases have been recorded to data represent	conting 40/ of the total negulation (O FFO COO)		

- A total of 104 099 cases have been recorded to-date, representing 4% of the total population (2 550 226).
- More female cases 54 821 (53%) have been recorded compared to male cases 49 278 (47%).
- Of the total confirmed cases, 3 579 (3%) are Health Workers.
  - 2 943 (82%) State; 630 (18%) Private, 6 (0.2%) Non-Governmental Organizations.
  - 3 236 (90%) recoveries and 12 (0.3%) deaths.
- The recovery rate now stands at 74%.
- All fourteen (14) regions have reported confirmed cases; Khomas and Erongo regions reported the highest with 38 559 (37%) and 15 496 (15%) respectively.
- Of the total fatalities, 1 712 (88%) are COVID-19 deaths while 199 (12%) are COVID-19 related deaths. The case fatality rate now stands at 2%.

- The laboratory testing capacity has been enhanced; with a total of thirteen (13) laboratories carrying out the testing of samples: NIP (including Oshakati), Path-Care, UNAM Molecular, Central Veterinary Laboratory, Namib Poultry, NAMDEB Molecular, NamPath, Namibia Central Pathology, DiagnoLab, High Care, Alpha Medical Laboratory, Des-Jo Medical Test Centre and ProQuest Diagnostic Laboratory.
- To date, 559 912 tests (including 13 254 re-tests) have been conducted by authorized laboratories.
- Since the beginning of the outbreak, 118 768 contacts of confirmed cases have been identified, 571 new contacts were identified within the last 24 hours from 13 regions.
- Cumulatively, 110 879 contacts have completed their monitoring period, while 134 contacts are lost to follow-up and a total of 18 870 (18%) contacts of confirmed cases have tested positive.
- Today, 5 102 (72%) out of 7 131 active contacts
- Of the total confirmed cases, 63 373 (61%) are in the 20-49 years age-brackets which constitutes the majority of the recorded cases.
- A total of 17 315 (17%) of the confirmed cases are among the 5-19 years category.
- The under 5 years age group make up 2 170 (2%) of the total cases whereas, 9 039 (9%) are above 60 years of age.





Figure 1: Age and Sex distribution of COVID-19 confirmed cases 08 July 2021

Today (08/07/2021), 598 calls were answered including 10 alerts.




Figure 2: Epi-curve for confirmed COVID-19 cases, 08 July 2021
