## **HIGHLIGHTS/SITUATION UPDATE (11/07/2021)**

- A total of 108 055 cases have been recorded to-date, representing 4% of the total population (2 550 226).
- More female cases 57 001 (53%) have been recorded compared to male cases 51 054 (47%).
- Of the total confirmed cases, 3 702 (3%) are Health Workers.
  - 3 056 (83%) State; 639 (17%) Private, 7 (0.2%) Non-Governmental Organizations.
  - 3 236 (87%) recoveries and 12 (0.3%) deaths.
- The recovery rate now stands at 73%.
- All fourteen (14) regions have reported confirmed cases; Khomas and Erongo regions reported the highest with 39 108 (36%) and 16 141 (15%) respectively.
- Of the total fatalities, 1 887 (90%) are COVID-19 deaths while 203 (10%) are COVID-19 related deaths. The case fatality rate now stands at 2%.

- The laboratory testing capacity has been enhanced; with a total of thirteen (13) laboratories carrying out the testing of samples: NIP (including Oshakati), Path-Care, UNAM Molecular, Central Veterinary Laboratory, Namib Poultry, NAMDEB Molecular, NamPath, Namibia Central Pathology, DiagnoLab, High Care, Alpha Medical Laboratory, Des-Jo Medical Test Centre and ProQuest Diagnostic Laboratory.
- To date, 569 989 tests (including 13 338 re-tests) have been conducted by authorized laboratories.
- Since the beginning of the outbreak, 119 976 contacts of confirmed cases have been identified, 275 new contacts were identified within the last 24 hours from 11 regions.
- Cumulatively, 112 318 contacts have completed their monitoring period, while 134 contacts are lost to follow-up and a total of 19 488 (18%) contacts of confirmed cases have tested positive.
- Today, 2 023 (30%) out of 6 856 active contacts
- Of the total confirmed cases, 65 791 (61%) are in the 20-49 years age-brackets which constitutes the majority of the recorded cases.
- A total of 17 724 (16%) of the confirmed cases are among the 5-19 years category.
- The under 5 years age group make up 2 261 (2%) of the total cases whereas, 9 561 (9%) are above 60 years of age.




Figure 1: Age and Sex distribution of COVID-19 confirmed cases 11 July 2021


