
- A total of 115 009 cases have been recorded to-date, representing 5% of the total population (2 550 226).
- More female cases 60 719 (53%) have been recorded compared to male cases 54 290 (47%).
- Of the total confirmed cases, 3 899 (3%) are Health Workers.
 - 3 245 (83%) State; 646 (17%) Private, 8 (0.2%) Non-Governmental Organizations.
 - 3 475 (89%) recoveries and 13 (0.3%) deaths.
- The recovery rate now stands at 79%.
- All fourteen (14) regions have reported confirmed cases; Khomas and Erongo regions reported the highest with 40 306 (35%) and 16 971 (15%) respectively.
- Of the total fatalities, 2 472 (91%) are COVID-19 deaths while 242 (9%) are COVID-19 related deaths. The case fatality rate now stands at 2.4%.

- Today (21/07/2021), 604 calls were answered including 13 alerts.

- Since March 2020, 67 321 people have been placed into quarantine around the country.
- A total of 4 001 people are currently in quarantine, with 181 new admissions.

- Of the total confirmed cases, 69 710 (61%) are in the 20-49 years age-brackets which constitutes the majority of the recorded cases.
- A total of 18 411 (16%) of the confirmed cases are among the 5-19 years category.
- The under 5 years age group make up 2 422 (2%) of the total cases whereas, 10 761 (9%) are above 60 years of age.




Figure 2: Age and Sex distribution of COVID-19 confirmed cases 21 July 2021

- The laboratory testing capacity has been enhanced; with a total of thirteen (13) laboratories carrying out the testing of samples: NIP (Including Oshakati), Path-Care, UNAM Molecular, Central Veterinary Laboratory, Namib Poultry, NAMDEB, NamPath, Namibia Central Pathology, DiagnoLab, High Care, Alpha Medical Laboratory, Des-Jo Medical Test Centre and ProQuest Diagnostic Laboratory.
- To date, 593 117 tests (including 13 656 re-tests) have been conducted by authorized laboratories.
- Since the beginning of the outbreak, 127 191 contacts of confirmed cases have been identified, 546 new contacts were identified within the last 24 hours from 12 regions.
- Cumulatively, 120 196 contacts have completed their monitoring period, while 140 contacts are lost to followup and a total of 21 261 (18%) contacts of confirmed cases have tested positive.
 - Today, 3 771 (65%) out of 5 790 active contacts were monitored.

PUBLIC HEALTH ACTION (S)

- > The COVID-19 vaccination programme is ongoing throughout the country
- The government and development partners continue to prioritize the continuation of essential health services.

CHALLENGES

- Non-adherence to COVID-19 Infection Prevention and Control (IPC) measures by the general public.
- High infection and fatality rate countrywide.

RECOMMENDATIONS

- ➤ Continue to give awareness on the importance of adhering to COVID-19 IPC measures; with the involvement of the Security Cluster.
- Continue to encourage the public to take the vaccine to reach herd immunity.
